Ship Building Returns To Dalmuir!

Project Story

The existing greenspace in Dalmuir Square was empty and underused, West Dunbartonshire Environment Trust wanted to change this. They wanted a design that would work in harmony with the overall Urban Regeneration Project, a space that was unique to Dalmuir, reflecting its historical past and to be a space where people wanted to spend time. This space is located to close transport links, cafes and a library so needed to be a fun space for everyone to use.

To create a playground around the history of Dalmuir, Proludic researched into the local area. The town was built around Shipyard in 1886, the first ship built was Battleship HMS Agamemnon. This ship became the inspiration for Proludic's design, taken from archived photos of the original boat. To enable to boat to reflect the original, bespoke Grafic Games was used, compact panels and stainless-steel panels made the ship appear to be under construction. Details of the ship included, GG ships telegraph, compass, anchor, lifebelt, name and number. A lifeboat springer, shipbuilder play panel, interactive ships wheel, hammock and balancing trail were also added to the site to create even more play value.





Proludic have created a fantastic play space which fits with our requirements to link with the area's naval shipbuilding heritage – we now have the first 'ship' built in Dalmuir for over sixty years! We've had a great response from the local community and now have a very busy and well-loved play space as a result.
