After

As part of a larger tender award, Latchmere Rec underwent a much-needed upgrade. The play area sits within a large park setting used by dog walkers, sports clubs and general leisure time. The play area had been neglected for many years and had a poor layout in relation to age appropriate zoning and inclusivity.

It was important to retain as much of the existing equipment and refurbish in order to maximise budget and play value. Our design work achieved this and-now the play area is hugely busy accommodating a much-increased number of happy users!

Funded by RB Kingston's Parks and Pavement programme Proludic were awarded a refurbishment package of six sites across the borough. We worked in close partnership with them and Kier to deliver all six sites within a 12 week programme, within budget. Their consultation programme was comprehensive ensuring we maximised the opportunity to consult with the local community. Post installation consultation was also carried out to ensure opinions were heard for future developments.
